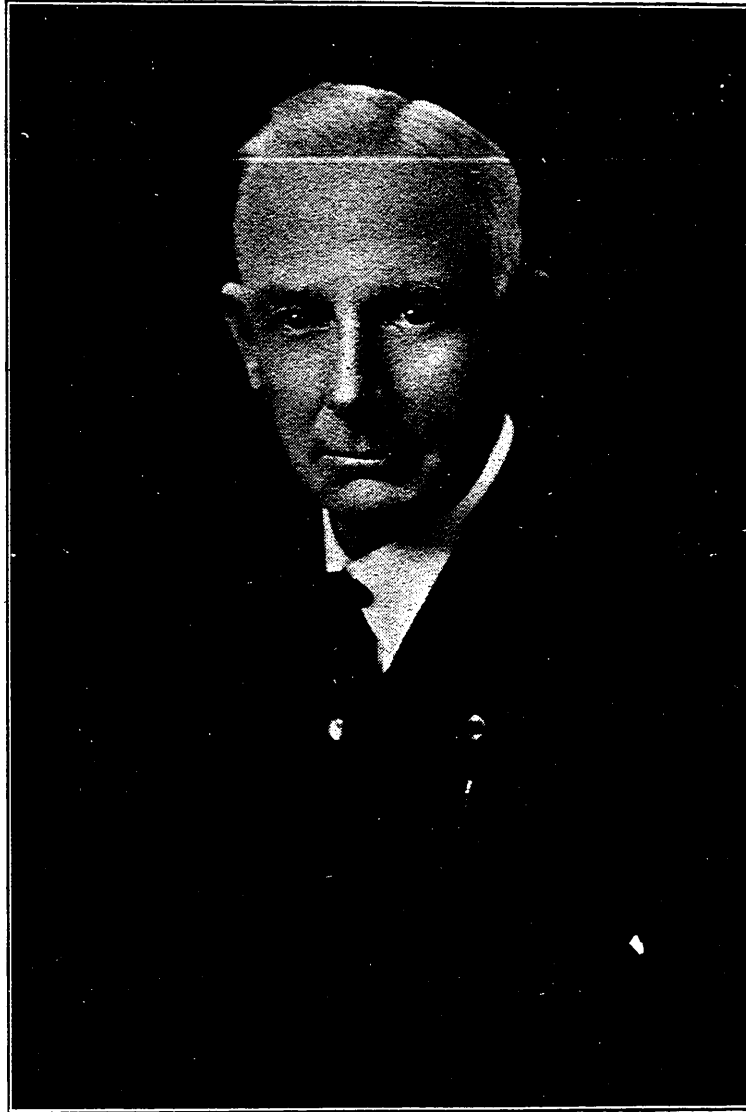

PREFACE

I have been unable to find a Montgomery Genealogy that showed any connection with our family, so I have had to work for all I have here, and while it does not seem to be very much, after it is put in book form, yet it took hundreds of letters and about ten years to get it together and in classified shape. Many would not answer my inquiries and I would get their report through some of their relatives. Most of the reports were incomplete when first received and required many letters to make them complete.

The names to start what I have of the Montgomery records are ELIAS MONTGOMERY and wife, SARAH LILLEY, and the dates of their deaths were furnished by Mrs. Amert Montgomery, wife of No. 14—EUGENE, who was a son of No. 2—ASA MONTGOMERY. Mrs. Amert Montgomery says this record was taken from an old record of EUGENE'S. She also states that No. 12—MEDAD claims that we have relatives living in Cortland, N. Y., and thinks his name is EDD Montgomery. This, I found out, is a son of No. 9—ELISHA MONTGOMERY, which I have been very successful in procuring almost a complete family record of.

Mrs. Dudley Montgomery, wife of No. 13—DUDLEY MONTGOMERY, states that a General Richard Montgomery of the Revolutionary War was killed in Canada and there is a table there with a description of the incident. She says he was a brother of some of our GREAT-grandfathers; that we are not eligible to the D. of R. through him. In a Montgomery family record that I have, it gives the following names of Montgomeries that were in the Revolutionary War, all enlisted from New York State: Alexander, Elijah, Ezekiel, Hugh, James, John, Peter, Richard and Robert.

Commencing with the Elias Montgomery family, running from one to nine, the record is very complete except seven and eight (John and Elias); no record of these two could be found.

I am sending a copy of this book to every family that I have record of, free of charge, and also wish to thank all who so kindly helped me, and hope that every one will appreciate my efforts in procuring what I have of our family records. I feel that I have done one good thing in my lifetime for my relatives. By placing a copy of this Genealogy in the hands of every family of living relatives, as I have done, it will be very little trouble in, say, twenty or thirty years from now, for someone that feels disposed to find one of these books and bring it down to date. It will make a good start for a genealogy any time, but it would be much better if the records were brought down to date about every thirty years or less. There may not be very many that will care to take the trouble and expense as I have done, but if they do and charge for the books, it should not be any trouble to sell them.

Alphabetical index of all names in the book.

State classification of Cities and Towns, alphabetically arranged, with complete addresses of all living at time of publication.

If you will take this book with you on your travels and when entering a State or City, turn to this State index, you can see at a glance what relatives are in, not only the State, but also the City or Town, with the local address of each.

There are several blank pages in the back of each book so that all may continue their records, and I earnestly desire that this will be done.

George F. Hurlburt was born at Harpersville, Broom County, N. Y., and died at Utica, Seward County, Nebraska, at the age of 85 years, 7 months and 7 days. Nancy Elizabeth Saxton was born in Madison County, Brookfield Township, N. Y., and died on the old homestead five and one-half miles south of Utica, Seward County, Nebraska, at the age of 44 years, 8 months and 19 days. They were both buried at Utica, Nebraska.

GEORGE F. HURLBURT spent his boyhood days on a farm near Harpersville, N. Y., attended a country school, and at the age of 17 he taught school, first at Harpersville, then in Pennsylvania; and from there, when about 21 years old, went to Ohio and then to Illinois, where he put in about seven years teaching school. He and Nancy E. Saxton were married at Northampton, Illinois, on Sept. 22, 1857, and moved on to a small farm near Northampton that he had purchased. The years 1858 and 1859 were very bad crop years, 1858 having frost every month in the year. This exhausted what little they had, and the farm depreciated in value so much that they turned it back to the original owner for what they owed on it, losing about \$1500, which was all that he had saved up from teaching for several years. In the winter of 1860 they moved with their two children by team to Coal Hollow (now Bartonville), about three miles west of the city of Peoria, Ill. Here he started from the bottom. The first year he dug coal by the bushel and then got a good position in the coal office weighing coal and settling with the miners and customers. He also put a man to hauling coal to Peoria for him by the bushel. In 1864 he joined Company G, Fourteenth Regiment of Illinois Infantry, and served to the end of the war.

In 1870 and 1871 he farmed about 40 acres in addition to his office work, making good use of his two oldest boys. The land he farmed was on the old Kickapoo Creek bottoms, and he had good crops both years.

In 1872, with their family of four boys and one girl (the oldest boy thirteen and the girl less than a year old) and their savings amounting to about \$1500 in horses, wagons, household goods and money, they decided to go west. Mr. Hurlburt, with the three oldest boys, moved overland by teams and wagons, settling on a homestead in Seward County, Nebraska; Mrs. Hurlburt and the two youngest children not coming until he had a house built. Success crowned their efforts here in a small way, notwithstanding the grasshoppers and other new country hardships. We hauled our first crop of wheat to Lincoln, Nebraska, a distance of about 40 miles. In 1877 Mrs. Hurlburt died, leaving a family of four boys and two girls, the youngest girl only one month old. Mother's two sisters, Emily and Eliza, came out from Illinois and stayed with us for about a year.

In 1881 he went into the grain business in Utica, Nebraska, and in January, 1882, he was joined by his son, C. G. Hurlburt, in the grain and mercantile business, and later the banking business was added. They remained in partnership and prospered so that all of the children received a good inheritance at his death.

He was active in business and public life, always in favor of consistent public improvements; was County Commissioner of Seward County for two three-year terms, and was a member of the village board and school board for several years. He believed there was more danger of rusting out than of wearing out, and he did business as long as he was able. His life was one of straightforward, honest dealing with everybody.

Clifford was born in Northampton, Peoria County, Illinois, and his address in 1925 is 1229 Eighth Street, San Diego, California. He is the compiler of this genealogy and is sending a copy free of charge to each family of Montgomery descendants mentioned in the book that is now living, and desires that all keep up their family records from now on.

I look back upon my boyhood days in old Coal Hollow, Illinois, where we lived until I was thirteen years old, and think what a carefree time we boys had. Father and mother were in very moderate circumstances; father was an excellent father and a good provider and mother was a real mother and a most excellent cook. Then in 1872 we moved overland by teams to Nebraska and settled on the old homestead, where we stayed for ten years. The country was new and a wonderful place for boys. We worked hard, but played just as hard. We lived near where Beaver Creek and Blue Ricer came together, and fishing, hunting and swimming was where we got busy when work was done. Father was a good general with his boys and never told them but once how to do a thing, but was very careful to not give them more than they could do if they applied themselves as they should. To my knowledge I never disappointed him in making good on what he gave me to accomplish. I will here relate an instance that showed what he expected and how miserable I would have been if I had disappointed him. In the year 1882 I went into business with him and Mr. Liggett. I handled a general store for a year and three months. Then father and I, with three others.

formed a co-partnership to conduct a bank, mercantile and grain business. When the little store was invoiced it was found that it had netted \$4000.00. My record was considered exceptionally good, I not having had any previous experience or education in the mercantile business. I bought and sold the goods, kept the store in shape and locked up to go to my meals.

In the co-partnership the five of us formed, I was selected to take charge of the bank. We knew nothing about a bank or banking, not even to keeping a checking account with a bank. Father stated to the members of the co-partnership that I could go to Lincoln, Nebraska, and stay in a bank two weeks and learn the business. The three partners thought he was expecting far too much, but he heeded them not and when the time came to go to Lincoln, not only father and the partners went with me, but a Mr. O. C. Ragan went along to see how father was going to start me out.

We went to the Lincoln National Bank and father introduced the bunch to the cashier, J. J. Kelly, and proceeded to tell him that we were about to start a bank and that I was to stay there two weeks to learn the business.

The old banker did not say it could not be done in so short a time, but proceeded to show us some of the things to be learned and accomplished to run a bank, thinking by this method to change father's mind about what I could do.

After the banker got through showing the different books and the system he was using, Mr. Ragan said to me, "What do you think about learning all of that in two weeks?" Father did not seem to pay any attention to what the others said, but told the cashier the boy would stay with him two weeks and learn how to run a bank. So off they went and left it up to the cashier and me. The cashier, without telling me, seemed to give up the idea of teaching me the business in two weeks and gave me one of the books of the bank to keep; which I did, but toward the last of the first week began to wonder what I was learning about the business, just taking care of the one book, and Saturday evening began to be very uneasy about it, wondering what father would say if I went home without knowing how to start the bank. Saturday evening I walked up and down the street in front of the hotel and after going to bed rolled and tumbled trying to think of some way to make good and not disappoint father. All day Sunday I walked around by myself and Sunday night went to bed very much troubled. I could not sleep, and the problem kept coming up until finally it came to me that if I just had a copy of everything they did in the bank I might use it as a reference. Then the idea of why not a blank book of the right size and shape to rule pages of the different books used in the bank and make entries under each heading and take copies of other things that I knew nothing about. By morning I was all wrought up about it and went straight to the cashier and told him that I had been there a week and it looked like I might stay another week and know practically nothing about the business. He said: "You can expect to learn but very little about the banking business in two weeks." This was very discouraging. Now we will see how the young man's earnest desire comes out in a battle with knowledge and experience. I braced up and told him how bad I would feel if I had to

disappoint father and went right on and laid my ideas before him as they had come to me Sunday night, and by the time I got through he was all attention and very much interested and said: "Capital idea, young man; capital idea." Then I said, "Will you come with me and help select a book to make the copies in?" and he said, "Sure."

Needless to say, we soon had a copy of pages with entries made of every book that we needed to start a bank; we also did a day's business, striking a balance, all in said book. Then the cashier said, "Now you make a credit and debits and do a day's business and balance it up." So I did and got a balance the first time. Then we took checks, drafts, pass books, certificates of deposit and everything they used and filled them out for me to take along.

At the end of two weeks I told the cashier that I believed I could go home and start the bank. He placed his hand on my shoulder and said: "Young man, I believe you can," and I did, but many's the time I got out the old book and copies to help me out. As soon as we got started up I received a wonderful letter from the old banker that I have in my files yet. Father and I prospered and bought out our partners one at a time until father and I were the sole owners, and we stayed in business together as long as he lived.

In November, 1916, after settling up father's estate and selling the bank that I had so successfully conducted for thirty-three years, I moved with my son, Ralph E. Hurlburt, and family, to San Diego, California, where I am investing in securities and enjoying this splendid southern country.

This was a starter in exchanging and trading, which he cultivated and proved very successful at.

Ralph in his boyhood days made the Merchants Bank of Utica, Nebraska, headquarters when not in school, and under the tuition of his father rapidly acquired ability along that line, so that when he finished school he was elected cashier, which position he held until the bank was sold in 1915. He also stayed with the new owners for one year to help them get acquainted with the trade.

About the 28th of October, 1916, he and his family, accompanied by his father, moved to San Diego, California, where they all are now residing.

Here Ralph and his uncle, Arthur C. Hurlburt, built the Sherman Apartments, a very fine place, where we all lived for about three years. He took up the building game soon after the Sherman Apartments were completed and at this writing (in 1925) is still very active in the work.

Ralph is very fond of outdoor games, such as baseball, tennis and golf. He was in the Nebraska State Baseball League. In tennis, he and his partner have held the doubles championship in the city of San Diego for the last five years, and the last two years they won the San Diego County tennis championship doubles.

The following experience will give some idea of Ralph's determination to succeed in what he undertakes:

At the time of the World War, he enlisted in the Navy, but before going in he got acquainted with an officer and talked over his chances of getting a commission and between them it was decided that he could make the grade.

Soon after joining the Navy he made application to join the officers' training school, and the old professor, a Yale man, asked him if he was a graduate of Yale or Harvard, and he said no. He said, "Are you a graduate of any College?" and he said, "No." "Have you studied astronomy?" "No." "Have you studied trigonometry?" "No." Then the professor said, "Young man, there is absolutely no use trying; it will only be a waste of time."

This broke Ralph all up, as he had set his mind on being an officer. He went to the officer he had talked to before going into the Navy and related what the professor had said, and the officer said, "I am acquainted with that professor and will see him and find out if anything can be done. He told the old professor that it was his opinion that if he would take Ralph into the officers' training school he would come out ahead of some of the Yale and Harvard graduates. The professor said, "Well, if that is the way you feel about it, I will give him a trial." So Ralph was accepted, and knowing that he had much more to do than the other fellows to be able to pass, worked very hard. When it came to the oral mathematics tests, which were quite extensive, Ralph's mathematical talent and banking education came to his rescue and helped him out wonderfully.

They gave such problems as, what is 19 times 19 and 29 times 29. Ralph was answering such a large percentage of them that the mathematical professor

pointed him out and said, you banker over there, just hold up and let some of the others answer part of these questions.

As the class progressed Ralph's good work made him a favorite with the professors and at the finish was chosen Valedictorian of the large class and had the honor and distinction of drilling the class in the Balboa Park during the graduation exercises.

Several of the Yale and Harvard graduates that entered the class failed to pass.

He and the writer, being very near the same age, always played and worked together, when one got into trouble in school it meant both; with this team work we managed to take care of ourselves in fine shape.

Lewis early attained a reputation of being a good boy to work. In harvest before he was fourteen years old, he shocked wheat after a Buckeye dropper and five binders, thus bringing together five swaths that was scattered over the ground and keeping up with the machine in one of the heaviest fields of spring wheat the crew harvested that season. It was afterwards demonstrated that this was more than a man's work. There was a big, husky fellow by the name of Thurman that said he could shock as much wheat as any thirteen-year-old boy, so they let him try it and in less than two hours he gave it up. He could not keep up the shack trot that was necessary to cover so much ground.

At the age of nineteen Lewis left home to try it alone. During the time he was gone, he went to school one year and was on the Pinkerton force in Chicago for a short time. He came home and took charge of the elevator at Hazard, Nebraska, and later moved to the old Homestead near Utica, Nebraska, which he afterwards traded for Colorado land.
