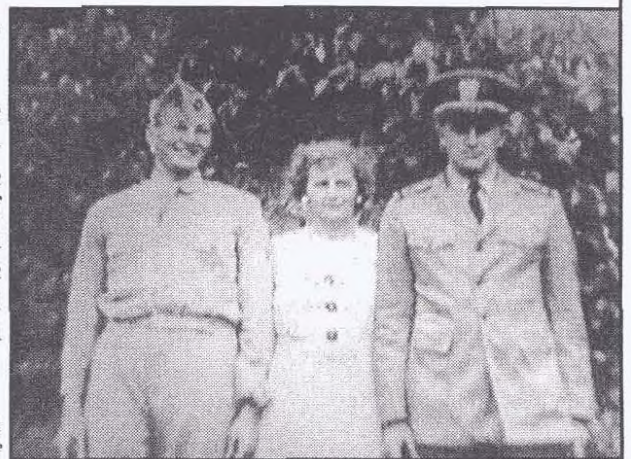
### John R. Montgomery, CMSI # 5

Upper Ohio Valley Vice President Hugh Montgomery announced the news of the death of his uncle, John R. Montgomery on March 5, 2006. Mr. Montgomery was CMSI number 5, and thus, obviously, a founding member of Clan Montgomery Society. Hugh said that his uncle had a great interest in family genealogy which he began early in life. The following is an obituary published in the *Springfield Republican* on March 8, 2006.

"John R. Montgomery MONSON - John Robert Montgomery, 86, of Bogam Rd., died March 5th at Wing Hospital."

"Born in Springfield, Mr. Montgomery grew up in Windsor Locks, CT, and was a 26-year resident of Monson. He graduated in 1941 from Yale University in Chemical Engineering. He was a director of M Corp and New England Electric Wire of Lisbon, NH. He was also a retired Monsanto Co. manager in Springfield MA, St. Louis, and London. He was the executive vice-president of Montgomery Co. in Windsor Locks, CT, and later, 1970-78, owner-operator of Berkshire Container Corp. in Pittsfield, MA.

"He leaves his wife, the former Valerie Van Nostrand; his brother, Hugh of Washington, DC; three children: Tom of Jackson WY, Meredith Charreyron of France, Jock of Bangkok, Thailand; four stepchildren, Robert Olmstead of Holyoke MA, Peter Olmstead of Maui, HI, Neil Olmstead of Wayland, MA and Laura O. Tonelli of Sudbury, MA; as well as 13 grandchildren."

This Montgomery family has served the United States in many ways. Aside from serving in the military in World War II, Robert's younger brother Hugh distinguished himself by serving as an educator and in the foreign service for most of his life. He was Ambassador to the UN during the first Bush administration, and is currently still working in Washington D.C. for the government.
