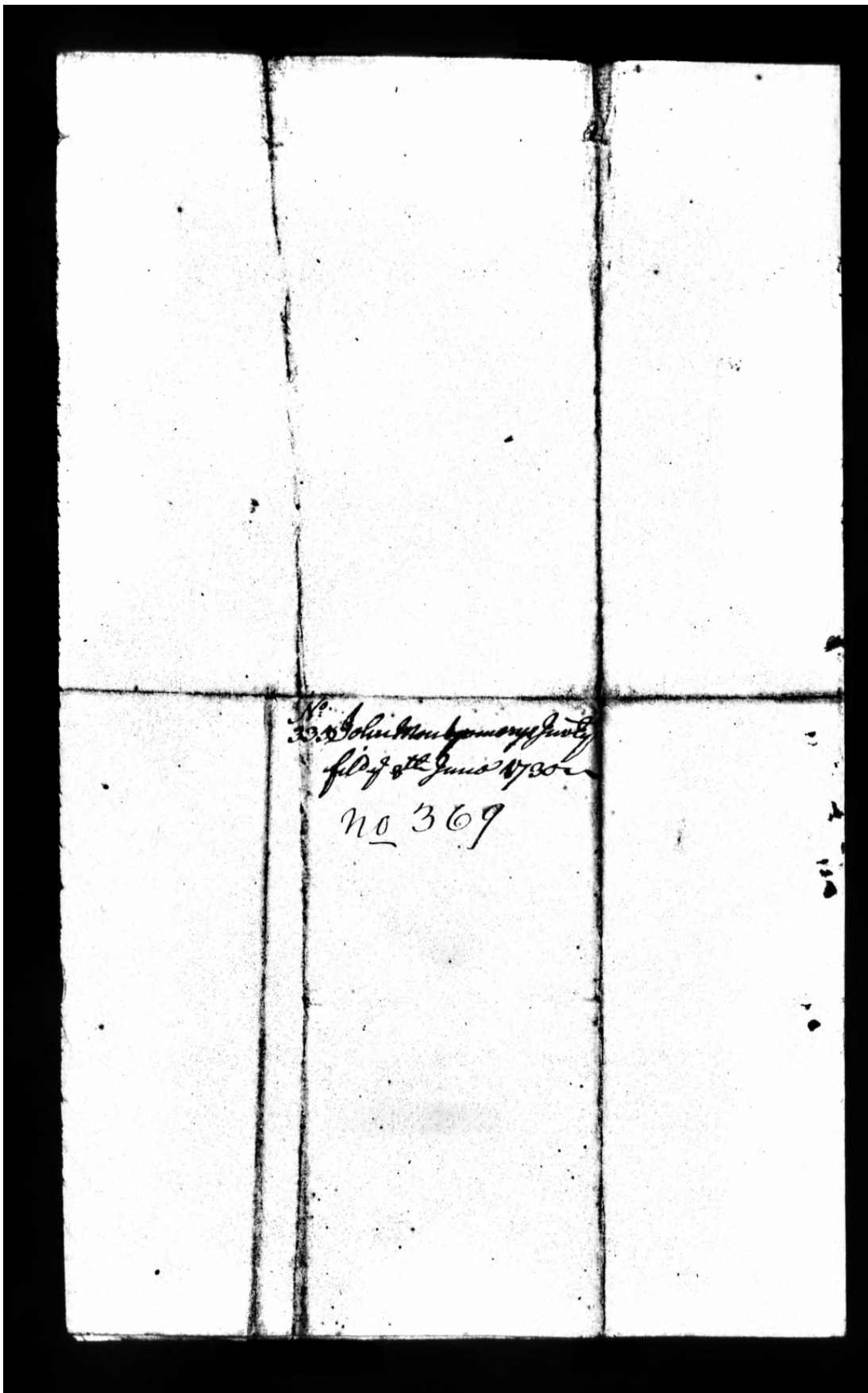

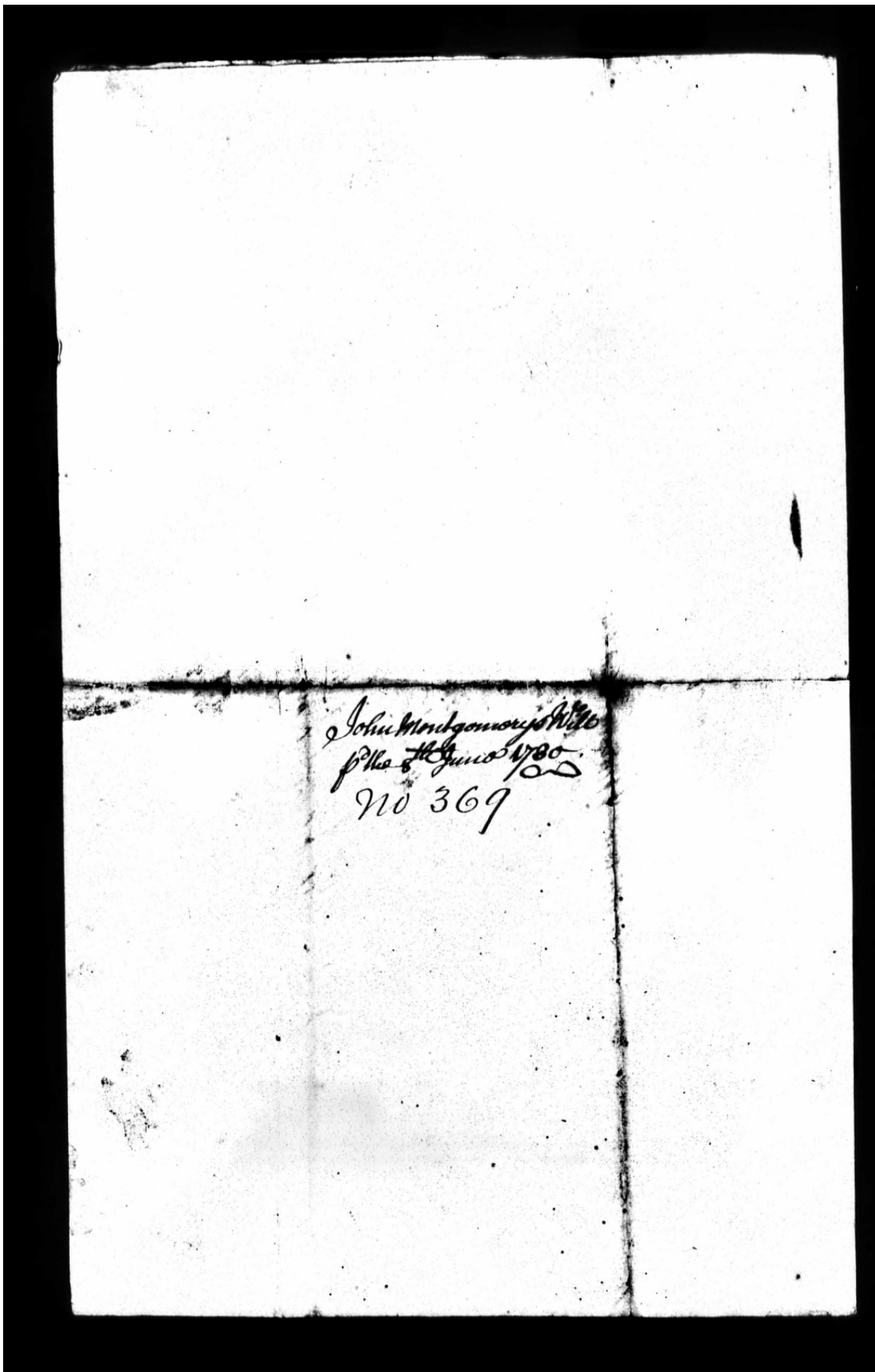

I John Montgomery of the Township of Newlonca in the County of Chester and province of Pennsylvania farmer being sick and weak in boddy but of perfect mind and memory thanks be given to God therefore Calling unto mind the Mortality of my body and knowing it is appointed for all men once to die do Make and ordain this my Last will and Testament that is to say Principally and first of all I Give and Recommend my Soul unto the hands of God if I have it and for my body I Recommend it unto the Earth to be buried in a Christian like and Decent manner at the discretion of my Executors nothing doubting but at the special Resurrection I shall Receive it again by the mighty power of God as touching such worldly Estate where with it hath pleased God to bless me in this life I Give and Devise to dispose of it as follows in the following manner and form

I Give and bequeath unto my dear & well beloved wife My real Estate if I have till my son William comes to the age of 21 years with all my reasonable Estate goods and Chattels rights Credits and whatsoever else I am possessed with except the following Legacies

I Give and bequeath to my son Robert the sum of 50 pounds of lawful money of the Province of Pennsylvania and bequeath to my son Robert the sum of 50 pounds of lawful money of the Province of Pennsylvania

I Give and bequeath to my three daughters Alice Jane and Ann the sum of five pounds Current Money of Pennsylvania a piece or to each of them to be paid by my Ex^{ors} out of my reasonable Estate when they come to the age of 21 years or Marry & as for their Mother to Give and bequeath to my daughter Margaret the sum of five Shillings Current Money of Pennsylvania to be paid by my Ex^{ors} out of my reasonable Estate

I Give and bequeath to my son Michael the sum of 20 pounds of Current Money of Pennsylvania to be paid out of my reasonable Estate by my Ex^{ors} when he comes to the age of 21 years

I Give and bequeath to my son John the sum of twenty pounds of Current Money of Pennsylvania also to be paid to him when he comes to the age of twenty one years by my Ex^{ors} out of my reasonable Estate

Life I give and devise and Dispose of the same in the Following manner and form, *Imprimis*.

Sum of five pounds Currant money of pensilvania a piece or to each of them to be paid by my Executors out of my personable Estate when they Come to y^e age of 21 years or marry and also for their mother to give unto them what she may think fit and be Convenient. Item I give & Bequeath to my Daughter Margant the sum of Five shillings Currant money of pensilvania to be paid by my Ex^{rs} out of my personable Estate. Item I give and Bequeath to my son Michael the sum of 20^l of Currant money of pensilvania to be paid out of my personable Estate by my Ex^{rs} when he Comes to the age of 21 years. Item I give and Bequeath to my son John the sum of Twenty pounds of Currant money of pensilvania also to be paid to him when he comes to the age of Twenty one years by my Ex^{rs} out of my personable Estate. Item I give and Bequeath to my son William and his male heirs all my real Estate that I have when he Comes to the age of Twenty one years only the Dwelling house for my wife to live in During her widdowhood & also for her to have liberty to get what fire wood she thinks fit & Liberty of the water and Garden during the said time and also he shall pay unto her after he comes to age the sum of Ten pounds of Currant money of pensilvania per year during her widdowhood out of the Real Estate but if my son William should have no male heirs it shall go to my son John's male heirs and if he has no male heirs it shall go to my son Michaels male heirs, but if he has none it shall go to my son Rob^t and his heirs. Item it is also my will and Decire that all my Children shall live with their mother untill they marry or come to age and if it so happen that any of my Children dye before they come to age that what I have Bequeathed them that Dyes shall belong to my Dear wife whom I also appoint to be my Ex^{rs} and my son Robert to see this my will well and Truly performed according to my mind & I do hereby Revoke & Dissolve all or any former will or Testament made by me I do Confirm this my Last will and Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the Day and year above writen signed sealed and Delivered in the presence of us.
